Camden County College Training Executive Honored with Community College Spirit Award

TRENTON, N.J.—At its annual Trustee Conference on June 16, the New Jersey Council of County Colleges presented the 2008 Community College Spirit Award to Camden County College Senior Account Executive Carol McCormick for her exemplary service to New Jersey’s community colleges.

“Since its inauguration in 1993, the Community College Spirit Award has been an honor bestowed to those who embody the community college spirit – perseverance, dedication and excellence,” said Dr. Richard Wellbrock, Council chairman.

McCormick was recognized for her accomplishments as one of five members of Team New Jersey, a group of community college customized training specialists who provided training to over 800 New Jersey small business employees as part of the New Jersey Basic Skills Workforce Training Program, a partnership among the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development, the New Jersey Business & Industry Association and New Jersey’s community colleges.

“Team New Jersey booked 25 percent of the training that took place under this

partnership,” Wellbrock added.

McCormick has served as a senior account executive in Camden County College’s customized training department since 2005, where she is responsible for marketing, sales and delivery of customized and contract training programs for New Jersey businesses and industries.
