Atlantic Cape Community College Director of Continuing Education Honored with Community College Spirit Award

TRENTON, N.J.—At its annual Trustee Conference on June 16, the New Jersey Council of County Colleges presented the 2008 Community College Spirit Award to Atlantic Cape Community College Director of Continuing Education Marketing and the Institute for Service Excellence Sherwood Taylor for his exemplary service to New Jersey’s community colleges.

“Since its inauguration in 1993, the Community College Spirit Award has been an honor bestowed to those who embody the community college spirit – perseverance, dedication and excellence,” said Dr. Richard Wellbrock, Council chairman.

Taylor was recognized for his accomplishments as one of five members of Team New Jersey, a group of community college customized training specialists who provided training to over 800 New Jersey small business employees as part of the New Jersey Basic Skills Workforce Training Program, a partnership among the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development, the New Jersey Business & Industry Association and New Jersey’s community colleges.

“Team New Jersey booked 25 percent of the training that took place under this

partnership,” Wellbrock added.

As the director of continuing education marketing and the Institute for Service Excellence at Atlantic Cape Community College, Taylor is responsible for the college’s retail, sales and service training program facility, and the marketing for career training programs, workshops and seminars, Casino Career Institute, Health Professions Institute, corporate training and all grant funded projects.

Taylor has over 20 years experience in the development and instruction of classroom, online and corporate training programs. He has established a strong reputation in the design, delivery, and marketing of adult programs and customized training. He has delivered over 1,000 seminars and workshops and instructed over 7,000 hours of corporate and workforce career training classes.
